<u>conferences-matter-and-how-to.html</u>. Developers are a critical asset to any company, and training is critical to keeping those assets up to speed and motivated. That blog post may give you ammunition to help persuade bosses who are reluctant to dig into their pockets.

Secondly, consider the insanely low price of CodeMash: \$175 normal registration, and \$88 per night for a room at the Kalahari Lodge. (That rate expires 12/24.) Similar conferences such as Software Development Expo or DevConnections run in the thousands, plus you have to get on a plane and fly out to the east or west coast. CodeMash is exceedingly cheap and is right in the middle of the Heartland region.

Are you concerned about the distance to the conference's location? CodeMash 2007 had attendees from over 12 states travel in to Sandusky. If they're excited enough to travel then you ought to be too!
